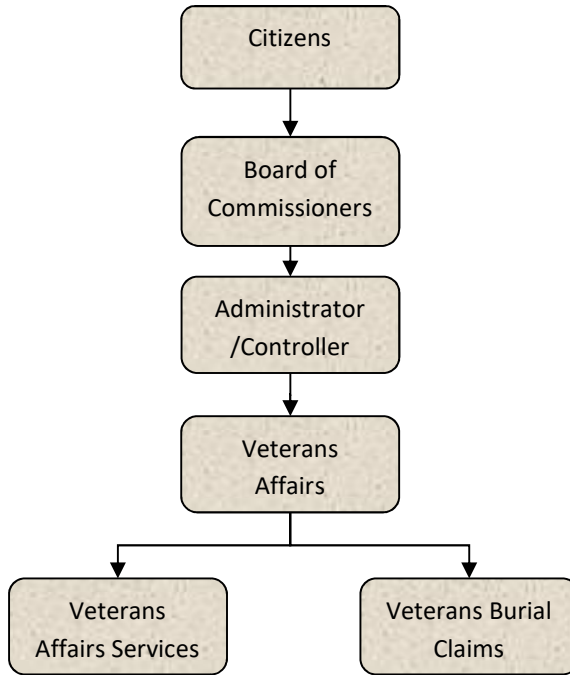

Veteran Burial Claims assists families of deceased veterans with expenses for their funerals.

Through this office, the county supplies all flags that are placed on all graves of veterans buried in Jackson County.

To serve as the veteran’s representative to assist veterans and their families in exploring and applying for a wide range of VA benefits

These benefits include, but are not limited to; disability compensation & pension, education & training, career exploration, home loans, burial benefits, dependent & survivor benefits, healthcare and life insurance claims.

Assist veterans in coordinating social services through related state and local agencies. All Michigan counties are mandated to provide relief and burial benefits to eligible veterans and their family members.

There are 10,2015 veterans from Jackson County in the VA GDx report that bring \$44,537,000 into the county in VA benefit money; our focus is to increase those numbers by creating more public awareness of the functions of this office.



Mission Statement

It is the mission of the Jackson County Veteran Affairs Department to ensure that veterans and their families receive all benefits they are entitled to from the VA, state and local programs. To preserve the dignity they deserve at the time of their greatest sorrow and to ensure that the veteran’s family receives the help they need to bury and/or to place his/her marker.

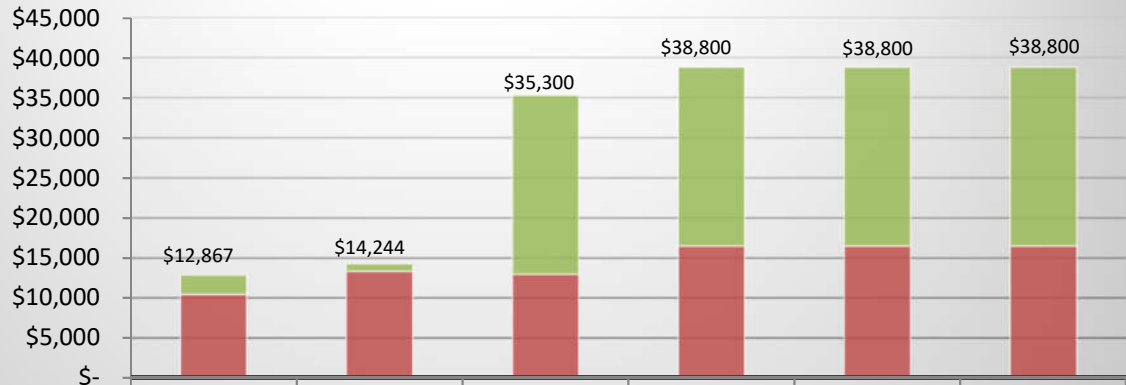
Accomplishments

 - Over 15,552

Currently in Jackson County, over \$44 million are being issued from the VA to the veteran citizens and their families. These funds are benefits for VA Compensation and Pension. When all programs from VA are considered there is over \$88 million spent on the veterans of our county.

✓ **Healthy Community**

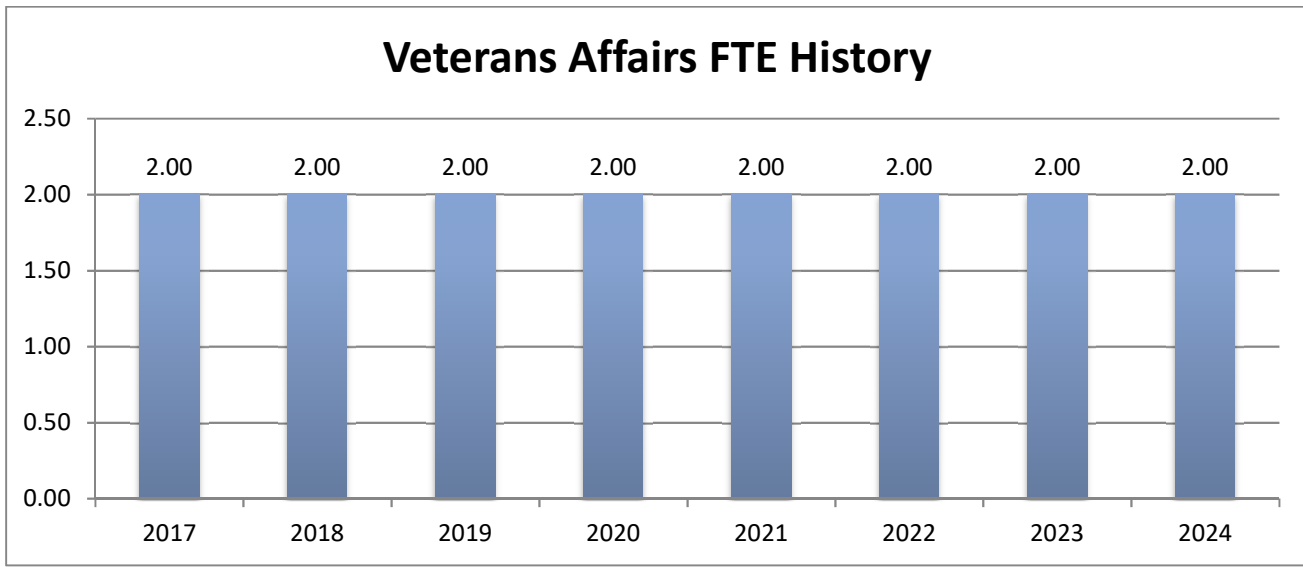
Through the VA Healthcare program, veterans with an honorable discharge are able to enroll into a program that will allow them to visit a doctor's office that is located within Jackson County, to receive medical treatment and prescriptions. Along with the guidelines of the program, VA Healthcare also includes a full service hospital in Ann Arbor. The program not only offers health care in the physical sense but also mental health care. Veterans in Jackson County Used \$41 million in VA health care this year alone.

Accomplishments

- ✓ Partnership with the American Legion Dept. Of Michigan provides an additional accredited service officers ten additional days a month
- ✓ Attended accredited service training in Higgins Lake MI in August 2022
- ✓ PACT ACT law passing has allowed for large influx new claims and medical benefits to be filed for veterans
- ✓ Fielded over 3,900 phone calls
- ✓ Scheduled veterans and/or family in over 640 appointments
- ✓ Mental health social worker from the Dearborn Vet Center in county office two times a month
 - No Cost to veteran or County of Jackson
 - Program currently assisting with 12-14 veterans
- ✓ Together the county office has been able to maintain a standard of excellence and efficiency and is able meet deadlines for filing claims within VA guidelines, giving veterans and their families the honor and excellence they have earned.

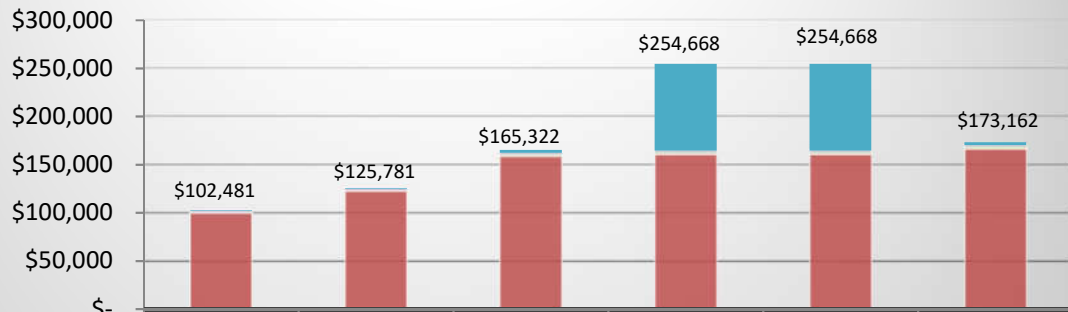

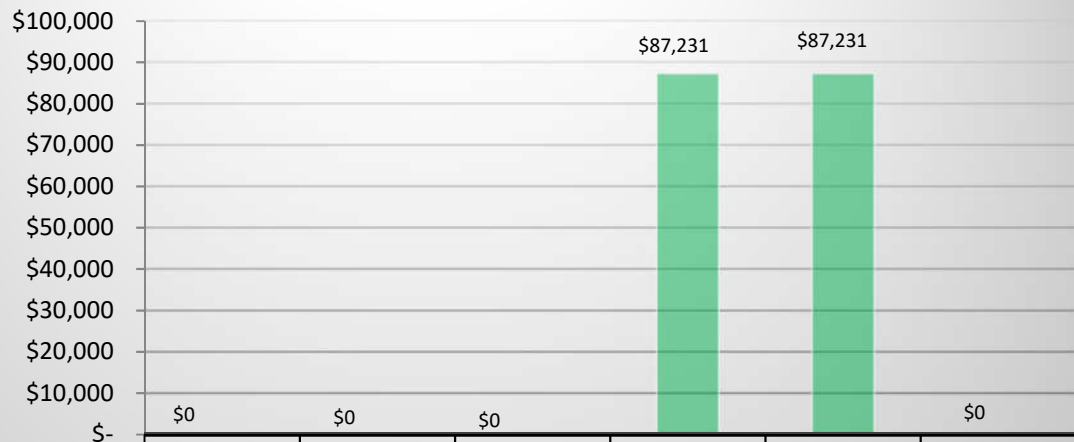
